_____ **Young Leaders Group (YLG)** – Any ULI member under the age of 35 qualifies to be a Young Leader. The YLG Committee consists of 20 members who meet on a monthly basis to plan programs that provide unique and exciting opportunities specifically for young professionals and students in the industry.

_____ **Next Leadership Team** – The Next leadership team is a group made up of diverse, mid-career industry leaders poised to take on greater leadership roles in their respective industries over the next ten years. This group facilitates internal discussions around topics affecting them personally, their organizations, and community.
